DOG PARKS

North Domingo Dog Park

Spacious park with separate large and small dog areas, plus wood chip ground cover, trees, awnings, benches, and lighting.

Los Altos Park

Dog park with separate sections for large and small dogs. Located at the corner of Eubank and I-40. It is a nice little dog park with very friendly people. “Heads up” though -- it is located along the fence line of adult softball fields. Luckily, most of the players know that if a dog gets to a ball they hit over first, he gets to keep it. Open 6

AM to 10 PM.

Rio Grande Triangle Park


This is one of several off-leash dog parks in Albuquerque, NM. Be sure to bring water for your dog, as this location does not have a doggie water fountain.

Tingly Beach

This location is in southwest Albuquerque in between the zoo, aquarium, and botanical garden. The majority of Tingly Beach is reserved for fishing, model boats, hiking/running, and pedal boats. The real treasure is what is hidden BEHIND the obvious. Just a few steps off the road to the southwest of the commotion are several areas to park and hike. Dogs must be leashed at Tingly Beach.

USS Bullhead Park

This off-leash dog park in southwest Albuquerque, NM is a great treat for your furry friends. Remember to have some water on hand, as this park doesn’t have a water supply for the dogs.





Coronado Dog Park

This off-leash dog area in Coronado park allows three furry friends per human. Puppies must be at least six months of age to enter the park. Be sure to bring water for your dog as it is not available on site.

Westgate Dog Park

Westgate Community Dog Park is one of the less busy dog parks in Albuquerque, probably due to its location. All in all, it is a very nice park that is well kept by the **city and community**.

The Paseo del Bosque Trail

The Paseo del Bosque Trail is a multi-use trail that's a great place to walk Fido in Albuquerque! The map below shows a parking area with convenient access to the Paseo del Bosque Trail. Roosevelt Park

One of Albuquerque's many dog parks, this off leash, no fence facility is a perfect place for your dog to run

and play. But be sure to bring water for your furry friend after play time is over

Petroglyph National Monument

Leashed pets are welcome throughout many of the areas within Petroglyph National Monument. Dogs can join you as you explore Rinconada Canyon, Piedras Marcadas Canyon, and the Volcanoes Day Use Area. The only areas where dogs are not allowed are the Boca Negra Canyon and inside any public buildings.

Tower Pond Park

This fenced, off-leash dog park in southwest Albuquerque allows dogs to play freely. There is no water supply available. The park is free to the public, and open from 6am to 10pm.

Santa Fe Village Dog Park

This off-leash dog park in northwest Albuquerque is a perfect spot for Fido to play with his four-legged compadres.

Montessa Dog Park

Off Leash dog park in Albuquerque, NM. No water available here, so be sure to bring some for your pup.

Riconanda Canyon Trail

See up to 300 petroglyphs on the Rinconada trail in Petroglyph National Monument. This 2.2-mile round trip trail offers easy to moderately strenuous hiking. Dogs must be leashed at all times. Bring plenty of water for you and your canine companion.

Sandia Crest Trail

This is a great hike located on the backside of the Sandia Mountains. It's a short 15-30 minutes drive from the beautiful city of Albuquerque. This trail is a beginner/intermediate level hike (some steep hills) and puppy friendly! The whole hike leads to the Sandia Crest, or spend a few hours looking for fossils (on the trail of course), and head back down! A great way to spend the morning, afternoon, or day with the people and puppies you love most. Make sure to bring water in your car as there is no potable water nearby.

Tom Bolack Urban Forest Park

This off-leash park features on fenced in area for little and big dogs to play together. Humans have access to a water spigot to fill dog bowls on hot summer days

Petroglyph National Monument

Multiple hiking trails varying in length with ancient petroglyphs etched into the rocks. There is no fee to enter the National Park, but there is one trail that has a parking fee, but that trail DOES NOT allow dogs. Watch out for snakes and bring plenty of water!

Canine Skyline Dog Park

This dog park is one big space for little pups and big pups alike. Fenced-in, feel free to allow your four-legged friend off leash.

Bud Warren and Lady Dog Park

Named after a beloved local crossing guard (Bud Warren) buried with his Labrador Retriever (Lady), this fenced-in dog park covers about two and a half acres of land. Fido try his best in the on-site agility course sit-



uated in this location dotted with native flowers. The park also features a small dog area.

Ouray Dog Park

Let your pooch frolic freely in this off-leash fenced dog park.

The Trails Dog Park

Off-leash park located in the Trails Community Park with a wood chip surface, water spigot, shade trees, and benches.

Rainbow Dog Park

Your pet will love to run off-leash at this fenced dog park with separate small dog area, dog and human drinking fountains, and crushed grave ground cover to reduce mud.

Rio Vista Dog Park

Dogs are welcome to join their humans at Rio Vista Park and Dog Park. Park features include basketball courts, BBQ grills, a skate park, picnic tables, a playground, shade structures, and a walking path. Dogs are permitted off leash in the dog park but must be leashed at all times in all other areas of the park.

Rio Rancho Sports Complex and Dog Park

Dogs are welcome to enjoy Rio Rancho Sports Complex and Dog Park with their humans. Park features include baseball and softball fields, a playground, picnic tables, drinking fountains, a skate park, walking paths, and two tennis courts. Dogs may be off leash in the dog park but must be leashed in all other areas of the park

at all times.

Havasu Park and Dog Park

Leashed dogs are welcome to join their humans throughout Havasu Park. This nearly 8-acre park features BBQ grills, picnic tables, drinking fountains, basketball courts, shade structure, walking path and playground. For off-leash fun, Havasu Park has a dog park where Fido can enjoy getting to know other pups and humans.

Star Heights Park

Leashed dogs are welcome to join their humans at Star Heights Park. Park features include volleyball courts, a skate park, basketball courts, a playground, picnic tables, and drinking fountains. Dogs must be leashed at all times.

Mountain View Park

Leashed dogs are welcome to join their humans throughout Mountain View Park and there is also an off-leash area where they can romp with their friends, human and canine. Features of this 20-acre park include BBQ grills, picnic tables, a playground, a shade structure, a skate park, and trails.
